NASA and SpaceX bring Americans to the Space station

With the first mission to return human spaceflight launches to American soil now targeted to lift off May 27, NASA will highlight the historic flight with a series of news conferences Friday, May 1, that will air live on NASA Television and the agency's website. In addition, NASA astronauts Robert Behnken and Douglas Hurley, who will serve as crew for the mission, will be available for remote interviews.

NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston will host a trio of media briefings beginning at 11 a.m. EDT May 1, to preview NASA's SpaceX Demo-2 mission. The flight test with NASA astronauts

aboard SpaceX's Crew Dragon spacecraft will lift off on a Falcon 9 rocket to the International Space Station from NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida.

All media participation in these news conferences and interviews will be remote; no media will be accommodated at any NASA site due to the COVID-19 pandemic. To participate in the briefings by phone or to request a remote interview with the crew members, reporters must email jsccommu@mail.nasa.gov no later than 5 p.m. Tuesday, April 28.

Following a May 27 launch, Behnken and Hurley are scheduled to arrive at the space station May 28 to join Expedition 63 commander Chris Cassidy of NASA and flight engineers Anatoly Ivanishin and Ivan Vagner of the Russian space agency Roscosmos.

Behnken will be the joint operations commander for the Demo-2 mission, responsible for activities such as rendezvous, docking and undocking, as well as Demo-2 activities while the spacecraft is docked to the space station. Selected as a NASA astronaut in 2000, Behnken completed two space shuttle flights. He flew on STS-123 in March 2008 and STS-130 in February 2010 and conducted three spacewalks during each mission. Born in St. Anne, Missouri, he has bachelor's degrees in physics and mechanical engineering from Washington University in St. Louis and earned a master's and doctorate in mechanical engineering from the California Institute of Technology. Before joining NASA, Behnken was a flight test engineer with the U.S. Air Force.

Hurley will be the spacecraft commander for Demo-2, responsible for activities such as launch, landing and recovery. Selected as an astronaut in 2000, Hurley has completed two spaceflights. He served as pilot and lead robotics operator for both STS-127 in July 2009 and STS-135, the final space shuttle mission, in July 2011. The New York native was born in Endicott, but considers Apalachin his hometown. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering from Tulane University in Louisiana and graduated from the U.S. Naval Test Pilot School in Patuxent River, Maryland. Before joining NASA, he was a fighter pilot and test pilot in the U.S. Marine Corps.

Military Intelligence Group:

Greetings, Marines!

Greetings, Marines!

We continue our tour of Klingon vessels in use during and before TOS¹, TAS², and the TOS Movies.³

This briefing is UNCLASSIFIED, from FASA's *Klingon Ship Recognition Manual* (1985); other sources found have been quoting this manual. Many ships found in FASA's material are no longer considered "canon" by CBS/Paramount (etc), but these are all in my 'head-canon.'

This month we focus on a Cruiser: (The Class VII) D-4 *Predator* (in Klingonaase: *d'ama*), the predecessor to the famed D-7 series.

A note on a term: Each ship is listed as "Class IX" or similar. In this usage, it refers to the sheer size of the ship in metric tons. See the chart on this page.

This class of ship pioneered the command-pod-forward design that has become the standard for most modern Klingon warships. The class was introduced on Stardate 1/8407 with the commissioning of eight ships, which had been produced at the alarming rate of one per month at facilities operating as if under wartime production orders.


This was a clear signal that the Klingons were either preparing for a war with either Romulan or Federation forces or were involved in a conflict along an unknown border. Only recently, because of

intelligence gained from Operation Dixie has it come to light that the Klingons ere in fact being attacked by an unknown enemy along their core-ward border. During this conflict, the D-4 saw extensive action and went through several modifications, many of which were never brought into full production. This conflict ended somewhere around Stardate 1/8610, slowing further development.



On Stardate 1/9108, the D-4E was tested and proclaimed successful. Production was converted over to this newer model, and by Stardate 1/9203 the first vessels of this type were commissioned. By 1/9501, the D-4A was no longer being produced, and most of the D-4As in service were being converted to D-4Es, which mounted a more powerful impulse drive system. (*Remember, the Four Years War between the Klingon Empire and the United Federation of Planets lasted from Stardate 1/9409 through 1/9806.*)

The major improvement was the replacement of the KD-2 disruptors by the KD-3, with a range of 120,000km, extending the offensive capability of the D-4 by 20,000km. The shielding system was also upgraded, with the new KSE deflector system giving the ship 65% more protection from incoming fire. The superstructure was also strengthened to handle the uprated equipment.

Even though the D-4 proved to be valuable in combat (witnessed by its class name of "Predator"), its days were numbered. The D-7, with its higher firepower and more powerful engines, would replace it by Stardate 2/0806.

Of the 814 D-4s built, 277 are in reserve fleets (48 D-4As, 229 D-4Es), 462 were destroyed, 14 have been captured (three As and six Es by Starfleet, two As and three Es by the Romulan Star Empire), six reported missing, 16 scrapped, 11 sold to the Orions (four As, seven Es) and 28 sold to prominent families of the Empire (10 As, 18 Es.)

Next month, we'll the D-9 *Seeker* Class VIII cruiser, designed for research and exploration, which entered production toward the end of the Four Years War.

Additionally, one believes that the other manuals will be published this year. M.A.C.O. has a new Commander, as the former commander has moved over to run STARFLEET Academy. De Rush, who ran for Commander, STARFLEET, has been named M.A.C.O. Commander, and I have applied to be her Deputy. (We'll see...) Meanwhile, RPG stuff.

Since my last article, I have played some Second Edition Advanced Dungeons & Dragons. Both before the Pandemic hit, and afterwards, I did buy some RPG stuff and I downloaded more! At Half-Price Books in late February, I found a book that (I thought) was a supplement for *Space:1889.* In a way, I was correct – but in a more accurate way, I was completely off.


The book in question was *Space:1889 -- Red Sands*, a campaign setting and guide for *Savage Worlds RPG*. The Savage Worlds system is designed as a generic-type RPG – one system with many, many settings, ranging from Fantasy (like Lankhmar) to Space Opera (like Flash Gordon) to blended genres, like Deadlands (Zombie/Westerns) and Weird Wars (supernaturals/war movies). I quickly became interested in the 'engine' of Savage Worlds. I was able to acquire a PDF copy of the **Savage Worlds Adventure Edition** (the most recent edition, also called "SWADE." The system is unusual, and uses dice, chips or markers (for "bennies"), and a deck of cards.

Like most "universal" role-playing game systems, character creation is a fairly detailed process, requiring the player to decide what type of character he wants to play long before making any decisions. The players who prefer a "let the dice fall where they may" system may not enjoy this as much.

When conducting my first research, I also got a copy (PDF, of course) of the *Savage Worlds of Flash Gordon*, the Flash Gordon setting of *Savage Worlds*. I'm enjoying reading the manual for that, as I've been a fan of Flash Gordon since I first saw a Buster Crabbe Flash Gordon serial on a UHF station⁴ growing up. I loved the 1980's movie – the one with music by Queen – as well! Maybe someday...

While I was searching, I also got a copy (PDF) of *Metamorphosis Alpha*, one of the earliest RPGs by TSR, Inc. MA takes place entirely on the Starship *Warden*, a generational starship that left Earth thousands of years ago. Somewhere along the journey, it ran into a strange radiation area which killed the officers and crew, mutated many of the surviving passengers, and damaged the ship's automatic systems in such a way that now – many centuries later – no one is aware that the ship is a ship at all! (Think TOS episode "*For the World Is Hollow and I Have Touched the Sky*", but with robots, animals, and mutants!)

I've also downloaded copies of Modiphus' *John Carter of Mars* (Barsoom) RPG (which I haven't even scanned yet), and I have begun gathering the core rulebooks of *Castles and Crusades* by Troll Lord Games, which appears to be a very nice blend of "Old School" AD&D and d20 D&D, with some unique ideas blended in. It may be the next game that Tracy and I play, several months from now.



It seems that some of the crew are all interested in playing a game of (FASA's) Star Trek: The Roleplaying Game when I can put an adventure together... I seem to be limited in time. I'll continue to try as best I can and will keep you all informed when I'm ready.
